Class learning planners are sent home termly along with class news and uploaded to TEAMS.


Regular Tweets are sent to inform parents/carers of the latest learning that is taking place.

Currently approximately 8% of our children have a SEN (Special Educational Need) and parents are made aware.


Mrs Freeman is our SENCO who works across the trust to support children, families and staff with SEN provision.

We are delighted that our curriculum offer is valued and well-known at home.


Since the 'Lockdown' especially, we have made sure that ALL subjects are taught.

We offer the National Curriculum and also offer further experiences such as musical tuition.


Residential experiences in Y2, 4 and 6 offer the chance for children to develop skills outside of school.
