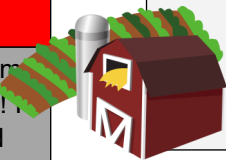

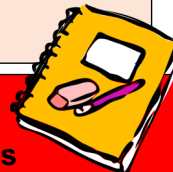


Class: Beech
